Methodology – Survey Specifications

The national survey oversampled respondents in New Mexico and Los Angeles


- The survey was conducted with a sample of Latino parents, primary caregivers, and expecting families (N = 1300 +/- 2.7%) across the nation who have children ages 0-5 living in their homes.
- The survey has an oversample of Latino parents in New Mexico and Los Angeles County.
- Field Dates: September 6-October 4, 2022
- Data was collected through a blended approach including web-based and telephone interviews (both landlines and cell phones) in either Spanish or English.
- The survey was among the first to have content specific to gun violence among Latino families.

Gun Violence is a Top Concern for Latino Families

Gun violence and mass shootings are a top 5 level priority for Latino parents across the nation.

24% of Latino voters named gun violence and mass shootings as a top concern in our 2022 National Election Survey with AARC.


What are the most important issues facing the [Latino/Hispanic] community that you think the government should address?

What are the most important issues facing the [Latino/Hispanic] community that you think the government should address?





Many Parents and Expectant Parents Have Already Experienced a Violent Shooting Firsthand

Have you or any of your children ever been at school or a public place during a violent shooting incident?

Nearly one-fifth (18%) of respondents have (either themselves or their children) been at school or a public place during a violent shooting incident.


Over one in four expectant parents have been at school or a public place during a violent shooting incident



Parents are Very Concerned About Their Child Being a Victim of a Mass Shooting


Over 60% are extremely concerned that their child could be a victim of a mass shooting; only 3% are unconcerned.

How concerned are you that your child could be a victim of a mass shooting at some point in their life?




This Concern is Especially High for Expectant Parents & Spanish Dominant Latino Parents
