



Methodology - Survey Specifications

- The survey was conducted with a national sample (N = 1,500) of Latino parents and primary caregivers of children 5 years of age or younger, including expecting families.
 - Oversamples in New Mexico and Los Angeles County
- Field Dates: November 8 November 27, 2023
- Data was collected through a blended approach including web-based and telephone interviews (both landlines and cell phones) in either Spanish or English.
- The data was weighted to ensure that the demographics of the sample match those defined by the U.S. Census.






Due to the rising cost of living, have you or someone in your household done any of the following to improve your family's financial well-being?



Parents Have to Make Difficult Decisions Due to Inflation



Over the past year, have you done any of the following to manage your financial situation due to price increases and the rising cost of living?




Childhood Futures

When thinking about a successful future for your child, which of the following career options would you most like to see your child pursue?




What would help you access more healthy, nutritious food?




Support for Stress and Anxiety is Needed





How much do you spend on child care per month?






Over 1 in 4 Have Reduced Hours Due to Lack of Childcare

Have you experienced any of the following in the past year due to challenges in one or more of your childcare arrangements? Select all that apply.





How important is it that childcare:






Which of the following are you currently doing to provide your children with a good future? Select all that apply.

GOAL 1: Access to highquality PROGRAMS

Has your child received child care?



GOAL 2: Diverse and qualified ECE WORKFORCE

- · Incentivize hiring bilingual workforce
- · Facilitate teachers' degree completion
- Develop a pathway to licensing for FFN
- Fund professional development in culturally responsive practices
- Increase teacher compensation and improve work conditions









GOAL 3: High-quality FAMILY ENGAGEMENT respectful of home language

- Disseminate culturally responsive resources to parents to support language development
- Fund evidence-based home visiting programs
- Increase research focused on Latino infants





GOAL 4: Access to HEALTH CARE

How many Latino parents cannot afford mental health?

Answer: 36%







GOAL 4: Access to HEALTH CARE

- Federal government should convert state options into guarantees to provide full prenatal and postpartum coverage, irrespective of immigration status.
- Waive the 5-year "waiting period" for eligible immigrants (Lift the Bar)
- Increase access to culturally and linguistically responsive mental health services







GOAL 5: Healthy and affordable FOOD

- · We support a SNAP program that:
 - Doesn't impose working requirements for SNAP
 - Extends benefits to Puerto Rico
 - · Eliminates eligibility limits
 - Removes the 5-year bar on participation for noncitizens
- · We support a WIC program that:
 - Makes permanent remote enrollment flexibility
 - Requires WIC agencies to extend certification periods to two years

1 in 5 Latino families went hungry in 2021









GOAL 6: Address GUN VIOLENCE

- Enact gun safety laws that include
 - Liability for gun manufacturers
 - Ban on assault weapons
 - Licensing
 - Background checks






GOAL 7: Ensure ECONOMIC WELL-BEING

- Adopt a national Paid Family and Medical Leave program
- Support equal pay for Latinas
- Expand Child Tax Credit
- Provide pathway to homeownership

Increase in Earned Income Tax Credit







GOAL 8: Dignity for IMMIGRANT families

- Provide a pathway to citizenship
- Ensure that judges consider potential hardship to minor children in all removal decisions
- Exercise executive authority to prioritize immigration enforcement resources
- Ensure regular training for ICE personnel who may come into contact with children
